## Cities & Ports as Market-Makers

Port cities are key global players.

Ports connect cities across the world through trade and innovation.

Ports and cities have the unique ability to act together on climate change, especially in their collective power to advance and accelerate deployment of zero emissions technologies and solutions through joint procurement commitments and policies. By working together, cities and ports can enable zero emission solutions at ports that reduce emissions from transport and supply chains far beyond the port area.

Oslo is successfully demonstrating how decarbonization can work across an entire value chain as well as how the public sector can successfully engage and incentivize the private sector through clear procurement strategy, and creative financing mechanisms.

Oslo is living through the green transition in the construction industry. Could this be a replicable model for other port cities around the world? Joint procurement strategies carried out collaboratively by cities and ports would create the purchasing power of many and send the signal to the market that the market exists. This approach could help overcome major financing and scalability barriers for zero emissions technologies. Increased development of zero ready port infrastructure, can help demonstrate growth without increasing emissions.
